General Summary

The materials testing supervisor supervises and performs tests on materials used statewide in construction and maintenance projects. Responsibilities are performed under general supervision.

Minimum/Required Qualifications

- High School Diploma or GED/HiSET and nine years of experience in technical positions, OR
- Associate's Degree in Civil Engineering Technology or related field and seven years of experience in technical positions, **OR**
- Bachelor's Degree in Civil Engineering Technology or related field and three years of experience in technical positions.
- OSHA 10-Hour Certification required within 90 days.
- Successful completion of a work simulation examination and a medical-physical examination.

Special Working Conditions/Job Characteristics

- Job requires moderate physical activity.
- Job requires exposure to moderately adverse and undesirable environmental conditions.
- Job may require operation of vehicles to plow snow and spread ice control materials.

Examples of Work

- 1. Supervises and performs physical testing of materials used in statewide construction and maintenance projects; prioritizes workload and assigns specific tasks to technicians.
- 2. Assembles and utilizes various electronic, mechanical, hydraulic, pneumatic, or nuclear equipment for testing samples; utilizes computers and other electronic equipment for data acquisition, reduction, and analysis.
- **3.** Conducts specialized and reference testing on materials; evaluates testing methods and equipment and may recommend changes to improve methods or equipment.
- **4.** Performs tests on proficiency samples; demonstrates testing procedures and equipment inspections in order to maintain central laboratory accreditation.
- **5.** Develops training materials and trains laboratory personnel, field inspectors (materials and construction), contractors, and new employees in proper testing procedures and techniques while adhering to federal and state testing methods.
- **6.** Reviews test results, checks adherence to specifications, performs calculations, and authorizes test results and reports; maintains records and prepares reports of testing results and activities using various computer software programs.
- **7.** Performs necessary tasks to maintain accreditation, including extensive equipment verification and calibration, and personnel competency evaluations.
- **8.** Performs supervisory responsibilities in a manner consistent with the department's equal opportunity policies.
- 9. Performs other responsibilities as required or assigned.
