


NE – Down 13%
















Siddens-Bening Law






Safety Assessment for Every Roadway (SAFER)



What is the SHSP?

- Data-driven, statewide coordinated plan that provides a comprehensive framework for reducing traffic-related fatalities and serious injuries on all public roadways.
- Designed to drive safety investment decisions and be coordinated with other safety plans
- Essentially consists of Emphasis Areas and Solutions
- Required to be developed every 5 years




- Met in November to get acquainted and set expectations
