Federal Transit Administration Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Goal For Federal Fiscal-Year 2025-2027

Executive Summary

An Overall Annual Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Goal has been developed for DBE participation in Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) and its subrecipients' (including transit systems and planning agencies) Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2025-2027 for federally assisted contracts. These goals were developed in compliance with federal regulations set forth at 49 CFR Part 26, Participation by DBE's in U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) Programs. The goal identifies the relative availability of DBE's based on evidence of ready, willing and able DBE's in relationship to all comparable businesses which are known to be available to compete for MoDOT's USDOT assisted contracts. The overall annual goal reflects staff's determination of the level of DBE participation that would be expected absent the effects of discrimination.

To determine the overall DBE Goal for FFY 2025-2027, a two-step process was considered. Step 1, base figures were calculated to determine the relative availability of DBE's in specific areas of expertise using the Missouri Unified Certification Program (UCP) Directory of Certified Disadvantaged Business Enterprises and the US Census Bureau data. Previously, MoDOT has made a Step 2 adjustment using the committed DBE participation in the past three fiscal years in U.S. DOT-assisted contracts. However, the committed DBE participation for the past three fiscal years has been 0.00%. Therefore, MoDOT will not make a Step 2 adjustment.

Use of Race-Neutral Methods and DBE Contract Goal:

The U.S. DOT regulations require that the maximum feasible portion of the DBE Overall Annual Goal be met by using race-neutral methods. Race-Neutral methods include making efforts to assure that bidding and contract requirements facilitate participation by DBE's and other small businesses; encouraging prime contractors to subcontract portions of the work that they might otherwise perform themselves; providing technical assistance, outreach, communications programs and other support services to facilitate consideration of DBE's and other small businesses.

Included in the Race Neutral analysis is a consideration of the amount of dollars awarded to DBE firms as prime contracts and dollars awarded to DBE firms as non-committed DBE's on projects.

MoDOT and its subrecipients will continue to advise prospective contractors for new contracts of areas of possible subcontracting, and of the availability of ready, willing and able subcontractors, including DBE firms, to perform such work.

Public Participation in Setting Overall Annual DBE Goals:

Federal regulations require that MoDOT post a notice on the website announcing MoDOT's proposed overall annual goals for FY 2025-2027 contracts assisted by U.S. DOT. Such notice informs the public of the proposed goal. A public notice was posted on MoDOT's External Civil Rights Division's website on July 18, 2024. (See Exhibit A)

Minority, women and general contractor groups, community-based organizations and DBE firms were invited to a teleconference consultation meeting that was held at 1:30 p.m. CT on July 31, 2024 to discuss the proposed FTA DBE goal. An email address was provided for attendees to provide any comments – no comments regarding the proposed overall DBE goal were received to date. If comments are received, those will be forwarded.

FTA Overall Annual DBE Goal

The base figures were weighted according to the expected amount of contract dollars to be expended in each North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Code summarized in Attachment 1, the Weighted DBE relative availability for FTA assisted contracts is 0.71%. A summary is included as Attachment 2.

It is recommended that 0.71% is the Overall 3-year DBE goal applicable to FFY 2025 - 2027 FTA assisted contracts. Due to the inability of meeting past goals, it is proposed to meet the 0.71% through race conscious means.

Race neutral participation will be monitored during this overall goal period and we'll be adjusted if determined necessary.
